For her first commission since leaving her role as Artistic Director of Scottish Dance Theatre, Fleur Darkin looks at the work of award-winning US writer David Foster Wallace to make a deeply personal work.

Originally premiering in 2012 after Fitzgerald's humanitarian visit to Haiti after the devastating earthquake in 2010, 7.0 (with accompanying score by Cannes award winning composer <u>Alex Baranowski</u> who scored the film *Nureyev*) is classic 2Faced Dance - high energy, fearless lifts and exceptional contact work. 21 mins

For her first work since leaving Scottish Dance Theatre, Darkin has taken the seminal US writer David Foster-Wallace's ground-breaking study of the American tennis player Michael Joyce and brought it to life as a dance for four men. 32 mins

Hollow in a World Too Full (Tamsin Fitzgerald)

As 2Faced Dance marked their 20th Anniversary, Fitzgerald created a solo for the first time in her history.

Featuring a new score from Alex Baranowski, it looks at Sidney Lumet's *Network* (1976) and its resonance today: "I don't have to tell you things are bad. Everybody knows things are bad. It's a depression. Everybody's out of work or scared of losing their job. We sit in a house and slowly the world we are living in is getting smaller." 16 mins

After multiple tours across Europe and Asia in 2018/19 with previous works RUN, Moon and What The Moon Saw we were excited to launch the 20th Anniversary tour of EVERYTHING [but the girl] in February 2020.
